





	<p>AUSTRALIAN WINE COMPANION 2010</p> <p>Dense colour; plush plummy fruit surrounds a core of mineral, with dark cherries adding brightness; the palate is velvet-like on entry, and offers dark, gamey, roast meat characters, which draws out to a gently spicy and quite tannic conclusion; super concentration, but not in the least heavy. The Ferrous is tremendous, with its balance of savoury to fruit sweetness. It's loaded with dark cherries and plums, a hint of eucalypt seamlessly integrated with oak. 	<p>THE AGE, EPICURE, Tuesday, February 16, 2010</p> <p>The name Ferrous suggests something to do with iron and, yes, this classy Mornington Peninsula pinot does seem to have a steely earthiness to it. It adds savoury complexity to a core of spiced plum and black-cherry fruit. The intense palate has sensuous, lush texture, yet lovely finesse. 	<p>The Wine Front, March 2010</p> <p>Loved the last vintage of Ferrous, not quite as keen on this one, despite all the critical praise heaped upon it – although obviously I do like it well enough. Tasted alongside the 07 Meres and an 07 Chambolle Musigny –which I liked drinking the most.</p> <p>It opens reductive, meaty and smelly but it comes good with dark cherry, spice and minty forest notes. It's dry and fairly tannic with the particularly tangy tart acidity being a dominant feature. Length is good, but the after taste is slightly sour and acidic. It's a meaty, smoky style of wine that needs a bit of time to settle.</p> <p>GARY WALSH 92 points</p>
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
