Kooyong's Meres is still tight, with slightly angular tannins that will mellow. But its core is morello and black cherries and tangy compote fruit, beautifully perfumed, with the oak superbly balanced.</p> <p>JANE FAULKNER</p>
	<p>WINEFRONT, 12th September, 2009</p> <p>This is a single vineyard wine from Kooyong. I wasn't a fan of the 2004 but I very much enjoyed both the 2005 and 2006 (though I notice that the 2005 isn't reviewed on this site – must rectify this). Needs to be decanted. It's then highly perfumed but dry, structured but generous in its flavours. It tastes of dark cherries, plums, woodsmoke, twigs and spicy oak. All the flavours are team players. Some deli-meat characters too. Lots of finish and resonance. Meres is known for its elegance, but this release has power and structure.
