A charming, but assertive short to medium term prospect whose floral perfume of sweet ripe red and black cherries, baked earth and briar, fresh cedary oak and forest floor reveal a suggestion of redcurrant. Underpinned by genuine extract and texture, its smooth, fine-grained palate emphasises its depth of juicy fruit, finished quite firm, with savoury, earthy elements. Rating 92
