A more savoury initiation to this wine with warm baking spice, sandalwood and then wild red berries. Has a medium weight profile with some plucky tannin and a long, fruit sweet finish. A neat expression. Rating 92/100

Campbell Mattinson and Gary Walsh

Has the finish that the 'Quartier' Shiraz lacks. Adds some extra polish too. Flavours of smooth, sweet plums, Asian spices, pepper and dark cherries. Smoky, cedary oak adds a friendly kiss. The tannin grip is all class – long and ropey. It's a sophisticated little number, but it has immediate appeal too.
