Tensile, mineral-clad and tightly furled across its aft, reined in by a framework high quality French oak and the oatmeal, truffled curd and reductive tension of extended lees handling. Gentle and mineral, with an extraordinary core of profoundly pure expressive fruit, this finely balanced chardonnay has a briny, mineral bouquet of grapefruit, pear and apple, matchstick/vanilla oak and spicy notes of clove and cinnamon. It's long and mouthwatering, with a luxuriant core of pristine fruit artfully knit with spicy new oak, a refreshing acidity and a tangy minerality, finishing with length and focus.

Bran flakes, smoke, tinned grapefruit, tangerine and jasmine. Light, tight and fine, spicy and kissed with oak, ripe lemon zing and juicy grapefruit segments, a little nectarine there too, but

sparkling with flint and bony charm, and a tense and cool finish of admirable length. Painting with watercolours, perhaps, but a significantly beautiful wine we have here. Love it.
