It rises to power on the back of meaty, weighty, black cherried fruit flavour, though notes of dried spice, smoky oak and tangy cranberry certainly contribute to the ascension. Ropes of tannin are the parliament in which the flavour cavorts. The outstanding form of this wine continues.

The highlight of Kooyong's 2014 pinots is a savoury and understated style of fine, mineral tannins, dried herb complexity and a subtle undercurrent of red fruit persistence. Tannins are finely structured and well balanced.
