Sturdy and dark-fruited as is Kooyong's stamp, Haven is a plume of bing cherry, blueberry, black plum and cinnamon flavours, given energy by bright acidity and silken tannins following. This is pinot's domain, in a riper sense. Vanillin, cedar oak frames and creams the wine's edges, nestling in nicely to be absorbed, surely, into the generous melee in time. To: 2025

One of the finest releases under this label, with a deep, heady, rose petal perfume of intense red and black berries and cherries, cinnamon and nutmeg, that soaks up its fresh, tightly knit oak. Medium in weight, it's juicy and mouthfilling, with a supremely elegant and harmonious presence of translucently pure cherry/berry fruit, fresh cedar/vanilla oak and fine-grained tannins, finishing with a lingering core of flavour, nuances of smoked bacon and a delightful acidity.
