The bouquet has a touch of a la mode funk, and the palate has more depth and power than Kooyong's '15 Chardonnay. If there's a criticism, its richness and punch doesn't leave much airspace for finesse, but that's no crime in a chardonnay world so fixated on elegance.

The subtle generosity of ripe white-peach fruit is evenly harmonised with the tang of lemon and the gunflint reductive complexity of wild fermentation in 20 percent new French oak barriques. It's finely structured and long.

Struck match and nectarine, nutty flavours and a slightly thick glycerol feel and honeyed taste, neatly cut back with the crunchy unripe pineapple and grapefruity acidity. Perhaps some apple-like flavour too, with the surge of fresh acidity carrying it long. Flavour and texture. It's a great mouthfeel of Chardonnay.
