This has quite a profoundly spicy nose: exotic Moroccan spices, fragrant and savoury, with an undercurrent of ripe dark-cherry fruit and sweet, earthy notes below that; the oak adds a meaty edge. The palate shows plenty of oak in terms of flavour and structure; toasty, sweet spices thread through bright, juicy cherry/plum flavours. Great length and definition here – plenty of time ahead too.

Musky, smoky and minty aromas of red cherries, redcurrants, chocolate/vanilla oak and baked earth are lifted by a scent of red flowers and backed by hints of menthol and briar. It's very firm and bony, with almost a sinewy structure beneath its bright, translucent fruit, finishing just a little hard and raw. It should flesh out and soften considerably after a couple of years.
