



Port Phillip Estate Red Hill Pinot Noir 2015 - Reviews

Red and black cherry, rhubarb, orange zest and a mulch of wet leaves and clove make the introduction. This sappy, midweighted pinot expands across a spider web of savoury whole cluster spike, sandy yet firm tannins and well appointed French oak, a quarter or so new. There is a flourish of nourishing flavour to finish.

Jeremy Oliver, June 2017 <u>Jeremy Oliver</u>

Very gentle and supple, this pristine, fine-grained pinot simply bursts with fruit and freshness. Its juicy bouquet of sweet dark cherries, plums and creamy cedar/vanilla oak reveals nuances of beetroot and underbrush. Supported by a fine-grained spine and backed by faintly toasty oak, its vibrant palate of cherries, berries and plums culminates in a tightly focused, nervy acidity. It's likely to flesh out into an intense and even more penetrative wine.

Rose oil and sappy perfume, juicy sweet and sour cherry, autumnal stuff, spice. Medium bodied, spiced cherry and plum, firm acidity, sappy flavours, a bit savoury, length good too, mulchy and pert.
