This is cool climate shiraz all the way. Seasoned with a dash of whole cluster fruit and aged in used French oak for 16 months, green olive, black and red cherries, deli cold cuts, fennel and cardamon all slink along a skein of white peppery acidity and fibrous tannins. Violet lifts the attack and the finish. An understated wine of real pedigree.

Rather wild and woolly in its youth, this spicy, savoury shiraz should develop complexity and balance. Laced with briary scents of blackberries, blood plums and cranberries backed by chocolate oak and suggestions of smoked meats, it's medium to fullish in weight, delivering a supple presence of red, black and blue berry flavours and gamey notes underpinned by tight-grained, dusty tannins.
