Jittery. Nervous. Chalky. Subtle. The most reticent of the swag. Apricot pith and faint stone fruit allusions jangle across a beam of vanilla-cedar oak, a skein of mineral tension and a core of mealy nourishment. This will age beautifully, attested to by the pulse of flavour, thrilling complexity and exhilarating length. This does need patience, though. Buy and wait.
