Everything is here and there is plenty of it. Polished and complex with wild winemaking notes of struck flint and well judged use of oak complexity to create a generous wine with detailed richness. The palate is harmonious with a wild ferment dryness holding the fruits middle and centre through to the finish. This appealing wine offers a lot of intensity.
