A gently herbal edge and leafy, sappy fruit aromas with roses and violets. Pepper-dusted strawberries, too. The palate has plenty of fine tannins clasping the fresh red cherries and red plums. Handy depth here.

Yes. It's in good shape. It has a kind of underlying firmness, a tension born of acid and tannin combined, neither dominating or overt to isolation. Spice notes, autumn leaves through strawberry, wafts of gun smoke. There's a suggestion of eucalypt in the background but it never pushes too far forward; it's just a kind of peppercorn infusion. Black tea, black cherry; both get a run. It's good now; it will improve; it flies its flag clear and high.
