Integrity and appeal are the hallmarks of this great value pinot. It's built around a core of black cherry and strawberry fruit, layered with a little whole bunch spice and supported by fine, supple tannins. It's approachable and ready, but will confidently hold out for a few years.

A mix of Mornington Peninsula vineyards makes an impression here, and one of the signatures is a saline/maritime note to the perfume that naturally comes from the variety. Think red cherry, mostly, with other typical notes such as herb, spice, and some leaf and whole bunch derived sap – just a faint sense, finely tuned – adding flavour and texture to a fine, dusting in the finish.
