Light straw-yellow colour. It smells nutty and savoury, and there is more than a suggestion of barrel fermentation. The palate is soft and light to medium-bodied, gentle and seamless, rounded and very approachable. An attractive wine, which does more with this grape than many attempt to do. It's dry, savoury and appetising on the finish, which is long lasting and has a little alcohol warmth.

Pretty, floral and spicy style, into pear, ginger and lychee. It's fresh, a little savoury, a little chalky, with a gentle smokiness and something of a grapefruit pith and bitter almond finish. Balanced. Flavoursome. Good.

A step up here with a really impressive Pinot Gris. The Beurrot vineyard comprises two parcels of Pinot Gris The original is just 0.24 hectares, while the larger parcel, which obviously provides the majority of the fruit, is 2.74 hectares. After harvesting, the grapes were gently whole-bunch pressed directly into old French oak for fermentation. After that, ten months on lees, with no bâtonnage and then bottling with minimal filtration and no fining. Pale straw, there is serious intensity here. Minerals and pears, fresh crisp apples and florals. There is fine balance, good power and serious concentration, as well as impressive persistence. With appealing texture and a finely crafted finish, this Pinot Gris is delicious now will drink well for some time to come.
