Fruit from 0.7 ha of the Meres Block, named because of the surrounding bodies of water. Their most exposed block. 100–120 m. Vinified in stainless steel. 20% whole bunch. Morello cherries and masses of strawberries and bit of raspberry and lavender and raspberry-leaf tea. Tannins like licking thyme and like rose petals. Loving the little sour tang and ping here. Tannins so delicate that they feel like strawberry-flower petals. Flooded with raspberries. Tiny note of tiny flowers. Like a little ballet dancer. Like light on water.

Light-ish red-purple colour with sweet/sour cherry and briar aromas, smoky charcuterie touches, dried flowers and herbs too, the whole amalgam showing gorgeous complexity. It's medium bodied and graceful across the tongue, a very elegant pinot with silky tannins and oddles of charm. The lingering aftertaste invites another sip.
